

Plant Problems & Quick Fixes



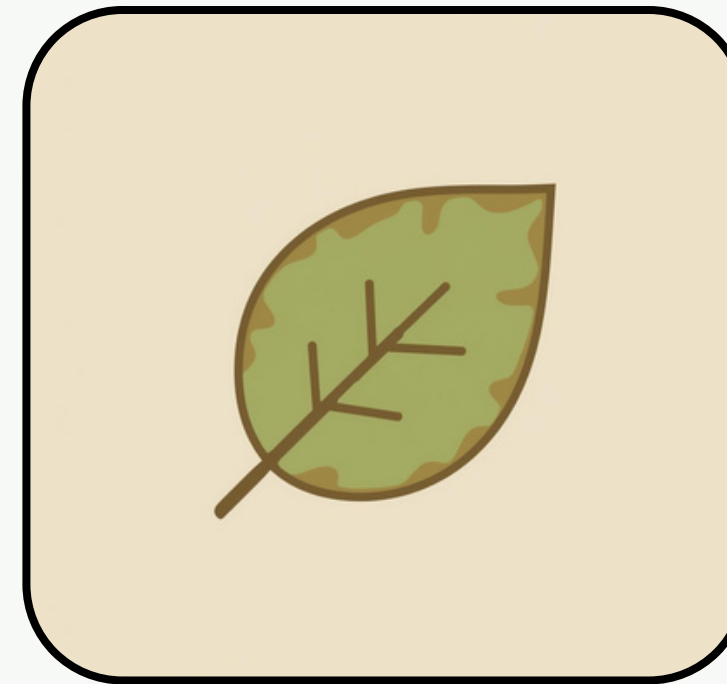
Yellow Leaves

Indicates nitrogen deficiency in plants.



Purple/Red Leaf Tints

Sign of phosphorus deficiency in growth.



Brown Leaf Edges

Possible potassium deficiency or over-fertilization.



Wilting Leaves

Caused by root rot from poor drainage.

Composting Problems & Solutions

Bad Smell

A bad smell from compost indicates it's too wet or contains excessive green materials. To resolve this, add brown materials like dried leaves and stir for aeration.

Fruit Flies

Fruit flies in compost often arise from excess moisture or food scraps. To prevent them, bury food waste deeper in the compost and cover with browns to deter access.

No Decomposition

If compost isn't decomposing, it may lack moisture or have too few greens. Ensure a balance; maintain a ratio of 70% brown materials to 30% green for optimal breakdown.

White Mold

The appearance of white mold in Bokashi composting is normal and indicates fermentation. No action is needed; it suggests the process is working as intended for efficient composting.
